Dr Milan B. Radulović, President of the Council of EKIP, participated in the meeting of the Miniboard of the Body of European Regulators for Electronic Communications (BEREC) in Bled, Slovenia

As part of the preparations for taking over the BEREC Chairmanship, the Agency for Communication Networks and Services of the Republic of Slovenia (AKOS) organised the BEREC Miniboard meeting in Bled, composed of the Chair Marko Mišmaš (AKOS, Slovenia) and the following Vice-Chairs: Robert Mourik (ComReg, Ireland), Alejandra de Iturriaga Gandini (CNMC, Spain), Klaus Steinmaurer (RTR, Austria), Michel Van Bellinghen (BIPT, Belgium), Sarah Jacquier-Pelissier (Arcep, France), Giacomo Lasorella (AGCOM, Italy), and Dr Milan B. Radulović (EKIP, Montenegro).

The meeting discussed the BEREC's Work Plan for 2026, which was prepared in coordination with the regulators from the Member States of the Body and sets out tasks related to enhancing connectivity, developing high-capacity networks, strengthening digital markets, and protecting users' rights.



The role of the BEREC Miniboard involves strategic planning and coordination of BEREC activities. Each Miniboard member is responsible for and oversees a specific area of BEREC's work. The Vice-Chairs provide support to the Chair and to designated clusters of BEREC Working Groups (WGs), in accordance with the established allocation.

As a Vice-Chair of the BEREC Miniboard, Dr Milan B. Radulović has been assigned to oversee the work of the Working Group on Roaming, the Working Group on Wireless Network Evolution, and the Working Group on Cybersecurity and Resilience.



One of the main challenges in 2026 will be to take note of and prepare expert responses to the Digital Networks Act (DNA) proposal. The proposal, which is expected to be published by the European Commission in January 2026, has the potential to have a significant impact on the future regulatory framework for electronic communications, investment incentives in networks and the conditions for the development of a competitive and innovative digital market in the EU.
